### ***Chaplain's Corner***

#### **Keeping Vigil:**

#### **Our liturgical year culminates in this sacred Easter night**

My Dear Brother Knights:

I vividly remember waiting last October during the dramatic rescue of the 33 Chilean miners who had been trapped a half-mile underground for over two months. I was only able to hear snatches of the rescue story, so I kept checking in to hear the number brought to the surface. I felt as if I was on watch, and that if I was not alert, something might go wrong. I felt that I could not let go until every last man was up and safe and going home. This vigil captured the world's attention. With the men's families and friends waiting anxiously above ground, rescue efforts continued for 70 days — a very long vigil, yet people everywhere kept it together.

A vigil is a time of amazing power. Ask anyone who has sat in a waiting room during a loved one's surgery. Ask the family waiting for news from a loved one stationed in a war zone. Ask a parent waiting for a teenager out past curfew — on a snowy night — with the family car!

In this same way, how can we help people grasp the power and beauty of Holy Week, especially its culmination in the Easter Vigil, this "most blessed of all nights"? Every ritual has brought us to this sacred moment, the pivotal night not only of Lent, but of the entire liturgical year. St. Paul, in Chapter 6 of his Letter to the Romans (Rom 6:1-11 is read at the Easter Vigil), gives us this crucial summary of our faith in Christ Jesus: What then shall we say? Shall we persist in sin that grace may abound? Of course not! How

can we who died to sin yet live in it? Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection. We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin. For a dead person has been absolved from sin. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as being dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.”

All of us have received the sacraments. The challenge is to connect our human experience with the power of these profound faith moments. What can parishes do? Connect the powerful imagery to the sacraments. Especially in this Easter season of baptismal, first Eucharist and marriage celebrations we can make connections to the central belief of God’s saving power over death with new life. Using homilies, prayers, music and surroundings to link the waters of life with Christ’s triumph over sin and darkness enables others to ponder that same relationship within ordinary moments of life. Make the connections throughout the entire liturgical year. Sometimes the only time we hear of Christ’s passion and resurrection is during Lent. While the Lenten season is meant as a special time of preparation for Easter, we are really preparing for and reminding ourselves about this essential experience all year. Our baptism bonds us to Christ’s death and new life. Like vine and branches, we are attached to God at our essential roots. Like sap running through the vine, Christ’s blood flows through our bodies as we join ourselves to his mission for the world. We need steady reminders. Invite!

We know people don’t come to things simply because of announcements, bulletins or Web sites. But people often come for the promise of growth for their lives. We must capture hearts! The ritual of the Triduum services, especially the Vigil with its darkness and light and proclamation of the Word, stirs our imaginations. Former candidates and catechumens know this power. They are often faithful participants in these services each year. What if we found a way to personally invite all who would be celebrating those sacraments during the Easter season: all the new and expectant parents, the couples preparing for marriage, the family preparing a child for first reconciliation and Eucharist? Do we even think of this as part of their formation as we guide them?

One of the Chilean miners and his wife decided to name their child, born while her father was still underground awaiting rescue, Esperanza: “Hope.” Hope — it is our greatest anchor when the world seems warped by sin. Our Easter Vigil offers us all the hope of new life and resurrection.

## ***From the Deputy Grand Knight's Desk***

Brothers,

Recently Grace and I attended a wake for a young man who had been killed in a car accident in Hunterdon County. You may have read about in the paper, the star outfielder for Hunterdon Central High School who hit a game winning home run last year in the state final, who was going to Temple University on a combination athletic/academic scholarship, who was being looked at by the Houston Astros, who was a leader in his school and most importantly a great son and brother. The accident occurred at 6:00 on a Saturday morning as he was headed off to baseball practice.

There were close to 4,000 people who attended the two viewings on St. Patrick's Day and close to 500 at the funeral service. This young man happened to be the son of two of my best friends during and after college. Gary and I were almost inseparable for the years after we graduated and before we married. Yet when I spoke with him a few days after his son was killed in that tragic accident, it was only the second time in about five years that we actually had time to talk. That had to be one of the hardest phone calls I ever had to make. During the call Gary said that when it was determined that Kevin was brain dead they were approached by the doctors and asked about organ donations, there was no decision to make, they wanted to make sure that their son was able to help people even in death.

I also spoke with Gary a week after the funeral to see how he was doing. They are still grieving. He told me that while no one will know what exactly happened, the police report was going to cite excessive speed and driver inexperience as the likely cause. There were no signs of texting, cell phone use or use of any other devices. He also said that his wife Karen and him are going to be addressing the student body in a few weeks to relay the message that that they believe their son's death needs to be brought out; you cannot physically make up for time that has passed, so you slow down and also make sure that you cherish your time on this Earth.... kind of sounds like **Tempest Fugit Momento Mori**.

**I ask that you keep the Gilbert family in your prayers.**

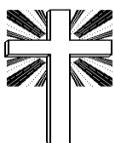

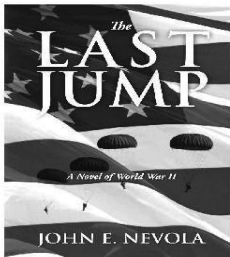
