### ***Chaplain's Corner***

My Dear Brother Knights:

#### **Remembering Heaven**

Have you ever had someone look at you with so much love that it nearly took your breath away? It is an experience that you'll never forget — one for which there are no words. There are many profound moments that we experience on our journey here, and I encourage you to take time to remember them. For parents, it may be the birth of a child. A major shift in your life happens, and you are overcome with a profound love, awe and wonder. Or if you are the adoptive parent who fell in love with a child before you ever met her, recall the moment you knew in your heart that this was your child. Remember those moments of contemplation, like standing in the splendor of a rainbow after a summer storm, watching the ocean, seeing the beauty of flowers or newborn puppies or kittens. These moments are mystical, magical and sacred. They open us to the realm of the spirit and connect us to eternal consciousness.

The readings for the July Sundays invite us, as brother knights, to come home again to the source of the first Love that called us into life and ministry — a Love that is “broad and high, deep and wide... always true, ever old and new... so the love of God” (lyrics from “So the Love of God,” by Dan Schutte). Having just celebrated Lent/Triduum/Easter and the season of mystical reflection on the risen life, Pentecost, plus baptisms, weddings, first Communions, confirmations and ordinations, it may be an understatement for ministers to admit that they are tired. But summer has come, time to slow down, take vacation, regroup and catch your breath: a time to be good to yourself.

These July weeks of Ordinary Time speak to us of God's unconditional, passionate love. They are ushered in on July 1 with the feast of the Sacred Heart. The scriptures remind us that “the Lord set his heart on you and chose you ” (Deut 7:7). As brother knights and as ministers involved in liturgy preparation, we seldom see the fruits of our efforts, and perhaps wonder if all the time and energy invested even makes a difference. On this side of heaven, we will never know for sure. It is easy to get discouraged and

caught up in self-doubt. Instead, allow God’s word over these weeks to wash over you and fill you with his peace and assurance: “Come to me all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you” (Matt 11:25).

We know how to refresh ourselves. On a hot summer day, there is nothing more refreshing than diving into a swimming pool, riding the waves of the ocean or even just downing a cold glass of ice water. Can we bring this same approach to immersing ourselves in the freshness of God’s word, letting the scriptural images wash over us and renew our inner spirit? In the Gospel readings for July, Jesus invites us to ponder the mysteries of the reign of God. He tells some of our most beloved parables: the sower who went out to sow; the amazing growth of the tiny mustard seed; the power of yeast kneaded into dough; the joy of finding a treasure in a field or a fine pearl; the big catch of the dragnet thrown into a lake. Jesus welcomes the crowds, and his heart is “moved with pity” as he feeds them and heals their sick.

Jesus is addressing these parables to us, as brother knights, telling us to ponder them. What treasures wait to be found in the field of our ministry? How can we recover our strength in the gifts all around us? Are there resources we thought we had lost but that reappear when we have rested? What new abilities can we develop through workshops and retreats? What support is there if we need to find healing?

I remember my first experience as a scuba diver. Even after all the classes, nothing prepared me for that first ocean dive. I remember how nervous I felt as I readied myself to roll off the back of the boat. The ocean that day was choppy on the surface, but as I entered the water and descended to a depth of about 30 feet, everything was absolute calm. I found myself in a world of silence, peace and beauty, and filled with awe by the color and life that surrounded me. Anxiety gave way to serenity as I felt welcomed and at home in a new environment. Every time we surrender ourselves to some new experience, it can seem frightening at first, but as in that ocean dive, fear soon gives way to reverence and self-assurance.

Ordinary Time is the liturgical cycle’s gift to those who minister. It is time to take care of ourselves and to rediscover our own giftedness in joy and gratitude, to encounter God’s love all over again. God searches us out, feeds us and heals us. In the words of the song by Dan Schutte, the good news is that we have been “found by a Love that would not let us go.”

**2011 Scholarship Wrap-Up**

**6 Scholarships Awarded Totaling \$8,500.00**

On Thursday night June 9<sup>th</sup> Council 6100 awarded scholarships to 6 high school students at the Senior Awards Ceremony held at the Mount Olive HS Performing Arts Center.

This year all recipients were from Mount Olive HS. The 4 Council 6100 scholarships presented by our Grand Knight Dave Teller were awarded to:

The Thomas Christopher De Lalla Memorial Scholarship, presented by Tom De Lalla, was awarded to:

The Ernie DiCicco Sr. Memorial Scholarship presented by PGKs Rick and Ernie and together with their mother Anne was awarded to:

Daniel Petrocelli \$4,000 - \$1,000/yr - 4 years Mount Olive HS

This year the Council scholarship committee received a total of 28 applications from 4 different high schools. This is the highest number of applications received over the past 9 years. Our average has been running around 22 per year. The break down for this year was, MOHS – 24, Pope John – 2, Morris Catholic – 1 and Gill St. Bernard’s – 1.

The scholarship committee, under the direction of committee chair Tom DeLalla, reviewed all Council 6100 applications and selected the winners based on the highest appraisals across all 5 categories: Scholastic Achievement, Church/Religious Institution activities, Community activities, Extra Curricular activities and Essay. As in previous years, to remove any bias in the selection process, all applications are submitted to and reviewed by the committee with the applicants identity removed.

Each committee member independently reviews and scores each application on a point system. The top 4 scores from each committee member are revealed at the selection meeting. Our process has proven to be an extremely efficient and effective way to reach consensus in selecting the winners. Over the past 9 years the choices across the committee have basically been unanimous with little or no debate. Even though we have different committee members from time to time the results year after year using this process have been consistent across the board for selecting the winners.

The Thomas Christopher De Lalla Memorial Scholarship, in its 7<sup>th</sup> year, was awarded to the candidate who best met the scholarship criteria for accomplishment, commitment, dedication, and leadership in activities and organizations to benefit others, the community and the youth of Mount Olive Township. The winner was selected from a pool 20 applicants which is up 1 over last year.

This is the 5<sup>th</sup> year the Ernie DiCicco Sr. scholarship was awarded and presented in the amount of \$4,000 (\$1,000/yr for 4 years). The winner was chosen from a pool of 16 applicants by the DiCicco family, based on overall participation in church, community and school activities in addition to a 500 word essay. Funding for this scholarship is provided through contributions to the Council 6100 Scholarship Fund specifically made in memory of Ernie DiCicco Sr. This \$1,000/year scholarship will be renewed annually for up to 4 years providing the student maintains a B average and is a full time student.

**Invitation to Pray With Fellow Brothers and Their Families**





The following motions were presented to and voted upon by the Council during this Business Meeting:

A motion was made by John Mania to pay the vouchers waiting to be paid by the Council. Ernie DiCicco seconded the motion and it passed by a unanimous voice vote.

1. Tom DeLalla announced the second reading of the slate of officers for Columbian Year (2011 – 2012) as listed on page 2. Motion made by Joe Mitru was to have the Recorder cast one ballot for the entire slate, second by Joe Devlin and it was approved by unanimous voice vote. Gerard Petrocelli, Recorder, casted one vote for the entire slate as nominated.

2. The second reading of the motion for the Council to spend up to \$600.00 to purchase Giant tickets, printing and miscellaneous expenses to run the Giant Ticket Raffle was made by Joe Barrett. Gerald Kaufhold seconded the motion and it passed by a unanimous vote.


