Chaplain's Corner

My Dear Brother Knights:

Pray, Bless and Do Not Curse!

Is there a proper blessing for the czar?" Many will remember this question from a scene in the Broadway musical (1964) and later film adaptation (1971) of "Fiddler on the Roof." Based on a story by Sholem Aleichem, "Fiddler," set in 1905, introduces us to the villagers who make their home in the tiny Russian village of Anatevka. Their hard lives are made harder still by the cruelties of the czar, whose soldiers regularly pillage the town and mistreat the inhabitants. The harshest blow of all comes in the form of an eviction notice; at the czar's command, every Jew is to depart Anatevka in three days, leaving behind all they know and love.

Against this backdrop of cruelty and injustice, the rabbi continues to teach the villagers that God has a blessing for everyone and everything. When they ask if that includes the czar, the rabbi resorts to a little humor and says, "May God bless and keep the czar ... far away from us!" Holy man of faith that he is, the rabbi cannot diminish God in any way; nor can he attribute to God any human desire for retribution or vengeance, however justifiable it may seem. All he can do is pray for protection for his people and for their perseverance in goodness.

This story, though fictional, could just as well be true. Today, "czars" of one sort or another continue to oppress others. On Sept. 11, the world will remember that 10 years ago, despicable crimes were perpetrated on innocent people in New York, Washington and Pennsylvania. Terrorists claiming to be acting in God's name continue to commit countless violent and unholy acts. Is there a blessing for them? Is there forgiveness even for them?

While broken hearts and wounded spirits cry out for revenge, and righteous rage often overwhelms our reason, the sacred texts for September offer another set of eyes through which to see the world and others: the eyes of the God, who created all and who has redeemed and forgiven all in Jesus Christ. On Sept. 18, Deutero-Isaiah, speaking for God, will remind us, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways." Then the prophet will encourage us to call out to the God who is generous in forgiving. In the Matthean Gospel for that same Sunday, Jesus will ask us if we are envious because God is generous.

Do we resent the fact that 11th-hour returnees to God will be blessed as richly as those who have followed God's way from the very sunrise of their lives? Do we expect that God cannot forgive people because we cannot — or will not?

On Sept. 25, we might hear our own thoughts echoed in the cry "The Lord's way is not fair!" While we may long to see the wicked suffer, God is ready to bless and preserve their lives if only they turn from their iniquity. Even if we do eventually learn to set resentment aside and appreciate God's generous mercies, the sacred texts remind us that more is required of us. On

this infamous anniversary of Sept. 11, Jesus ben Sira, Paul and the Matthean Jesus will unite to challenge us to forgive even when forgiveness seems impossible and foolish.

Can anyone nourish anger against another person and then expect healing from God? Can anyone refuse mercy to another person and then seek pardon for his or her own sins? These challenges of Jesus ben Sira are made even more rigorous by Jesus, who says we must forgive without limit. Paul, in the second reading for Sept. 11, will offer us the rationale for cultivating the virtue of forgiving what seems unforgiveable: "We are the Lord's!" Because of our belonging to God, in whose image we have been created, it is both our privilege and responsibility to be true to God in all we are, in all we do, in all we think and say. Our God, as revealed in the person and mission of Jesus, does not wish to condemn but to heal, forgive and save. Our God loves sinners to the extent that Jesus emptied himself of his power, his rights, his freedoms, his desire for vengeance and even his very life so that sinners might know life and forgiveness (Sept. 25). If this is who God is, and if it is true that "We are the Lord's," then, like God, we are to bless and not to curse, to pray for those who do us harm rather than seek their ruin. Some among us have been heard to declare, "I'll forgive but I'll never forget!" Such a claim, however, is contrary to the character of God, for whom forgiveness is always coupled with liberation.

Because God forgives by freeing the sinner from the domination of past history, those who are God's are to emulate this quality of divine amnesia. This challenge brings us full-circle to the question: "Is there a proper blessing for the czar?" Indeed, there is. In a High Holy Day Book published in 1895 in Russia, there is a prayer in Yiddish that concludes with: "And may the Merciful One put in the heart of the czar compassion and good deeds for the people of God."

This can also be our blessing for the "czars" of today.

This is a great place for those of you receiving our News Letter out of state to get involved. You can visit the secure site, make your contribution and receive your ticket. Isn't this great? No One has an excuse for not doing their part!

Once again, for those of you unfamiliar with the Sweepstake, let me explain. FootballMania is an exciting opportunity for participants because each ticket holder has

an equal chance of winning. There's no need to be a football guru... Each ticket contains 3 random teams in each week of the 17 week season. That's a different set of teams each week. No two tickets have the same 3 teams in any given week. Your \$20 ticket covers you for the entire season!

Winning tickets are determined based on the points scored by the football teams assigned to it for that week. If two tickets have the same score, the total yards gained by the 3 teams is used as a tiebreaker. Here's the bottom line: Last year we sold 290 tickets, paid out \$590 in prizes winners and made a profit of \$3,900.00 for the council. 


