Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

ST. PETER was martyred in Rome on the Vatican Hill about the year 67 A.D., and was buried nearby in a pagan cemetery. By 150 A.D. his tomb was marked with a monument.

The Emperor Constantine built the first church over that tomb, incorporating the ancient monument. On November 18, 326, Pope Sylvester I consecrated the first basilica there, which survived until the 16th century, when construction on the present basilica began in 1514. That church was consecrated on November 18, 1626; 1,300 years after the original basilica had been inaugurated.

St. Peter's Basilica is the largest church in the western world. World-famous artists and architects such as Michelangelo, Bernini and Raphael have worked on this building.

In 1939 Pope Pius XII began archaeological excavations under the basilica. After workers, who were digging a tomb for his predecessor, Pius XI, discovered signs of an ancient cemetery under the basilica. Below the crypt floor they found St. Peter's tomb.

The altar in the upper church is located directly over the tomb of St. Peter, which is two levels below the main floor of the basilica. The crypt area below the main floor provides space for the burial of popes and various church dignitaries.

Chaplain's Corner

My Dear Brother Knights,

Journey with the Johannine Community

Last month, Paul served as our guide and mentor, leading us through Holy Week and Easter, and echoing the mantra intended to transform each of us from within: "Have in you the mind of Jesus Christ." This month, Paul hands us off, as it were, to the capable care of the Johannine community, within which the fourth Gospel, the Johannine letters and the Book of Revelation were developed. As seven of the 12 sacred texts for the Sundays of May originated within the Johannine community, it may be helpful to renew acquaintances with them.

Gathered around their still to be named leader — called "John the Evangelist" by some, "the Beloved Disciple" by others — this community offered a unique verbal portrait of Jesus different from the one found in the Synoptics. As Raymond E. Brown wrote a few months before his death in August 1998, the Johannine community was centered on the mystery of the Incarnation, namely, that the Word who had life and existence before the world began entered fully into our flesh and blood existence. In this capacity, as one of us in all ways but sin, Jesus lived and taught, healed and suffered, died and rose to life in order to reveal the love of God and allow that love to illumine and sanctify every elemental human experience.

While other ancient Christian authors encouraged their readers to focus on the return of the risen Christ and to live in preparation for that moment, the Johannine community invites us to know and celebrate the blessings of eternity here and now. Jesus, who came among us, is ever present through the living word, through the living bread and in the powerful presence of his abiding Spirit.

With these assurances, we look to the message of the Johannine community for guidance and encouragement. On May 6, our ancestral brothers and sisters will challenge us to cultivate the integrity that must characterize every disciple of Jesus. “Let us love, not in word and speech but in deed and truth” (1 John 3:18). Integrating the faith we profess with our lips and the faith we profess through our words and works is a lifelong process that must be tended daily and can only be accomplished in union with Jesus. In the Gospel of Easter’s Fifth Sunday, the Johannine Jesus will describe that union in graphic terms: as a branch is one with the vine and depends on the vine for life, growth and fruitfulness, so must disciples cling to Jesus for life, for strength and for the courage we need to love in word and speech, in deed and truth. Only a close union will enable believers to survive attacks on their integrity.

On May 13, the Johannine community will engage us celebrating the love of God that assures us of forgiveness for our sins. Through the laying down of his own life for us, Jesus lifted us up above our enslavement to sin to the level of friendship with him and with God. Very simply but profoundly, the Johannine community insists that the only worthy response to such great love is the willingness to love one another in the same way. On Easter’s Seventh Sunday (May 20), the scriptures reprise this call to love and assure us that we are capable of such love, because God remains in us and we in God. To strengthen and inspire our authentic love, the Johannine Jesus will pray for us. “Keep them from the evil one,” Jesus will ask. “Consecrate them in the truth.” We have been consecrated in order to reflect God’s truth without fear and without falseness; we are to keep the words of Jesus’ prayer close to mind and heart and draw strength from it wherever we are challenged.

It can be difficult to speak and to live the truth without diminishing its power or altering its purpose. In a world where messengers with unpopular truths are often made to suffer, believers will require daily trips to the well of the word in order to remain strong. That trip will be especially refreshing on May 27 as believers celebrate the gift of the Spirit whom the risen Jesus breathed forth on all.

Empowered by the Spirit of Jesus, we are to be ambassadors of the peace Jesus won for each of us on the cross. While we respect one another’s differences, the peace of the Spirit enables us to witness to a unity that can only come from God. We speak many different languages; we ascribe to different ethnic groups; we preserve a variety of cultures and practice many unique customs; we hold fast to many diverse traditions. Instead of letting those things

divide us, the Spirit enables us to value these differences as necessary and complimentary facets of the one beautiful kaleidoscope of peoples we call church.


Upcoming Council Election




