Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

Praying the Mass – The Communion Rite

When I come to receive Communion, the minister of the Eucharist says to me, “The Body of Christ”... “The Blood of Christ,” and I say “Amen” to each.

Those are the biggest “Amens” I’ll ever say. I’m not simply saying “Amen” to the real presence. I’m saying “Amen” to receiving the Lord *into my life* – not some day when I’ve got everything worked out, but here and now.

In effect, I say, “Lord, I’m not perfect, and I don’t have all the answers. But I do believe in you, and I accept you into my life here and now.”

The cup has particular meaning. In Gethsemane, Jesus prayed, “*Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me.*” The cup of suffering wasn’t taken away. But by accepting it, Jesus found the path of life.

When I stand before the cup and say “Amen,” I’m saying, Lord. I accept, as you did, whatever sufferings cannot be taken away. I trust, as you trusted, that God will somehow make this something good. And I trust that if you are with me, I can do it.”

Think about those two Amens. Spend some time on each. And the next time you receive Communion, say them with a conviction that comes from way down deep inside.

Chaplain's Corner

My Dear Brother Knights,

Put on a New Self

I read a book review a few months ago that caught my attention. The book (*A Mindful Nation: How a Simple Practice Can Help Us Reduce Stress, Improve Performance and Recapture the American Spirit*) was written by Ohio Congressman Tim Ryan. Ryan is a practicing Catholic who traces his interest in mindfulness to the experiences of praying the rosary with grandparents and, later, learning the practice of centering prayer. At the age of 35, caught in the hard-fought scramble of political life and fearing burnout, Ryan took time to make a five-day silent retreat. And it has, as they say, made all the difference. Daily meditation has changed his life, and his passion for the practice has led him to work with scientists who study the effects of mindful meditation. The book is the result of that work.

I don't know if Congressman Ryan's book will have any great effect on the busy and scattered lives of our nation. One can only hope. But reading the Congressman's testament to the power of prayer, and his reference to centering prayer, prompted my own reflection.

Many years ago, a beloved pastor returned from a four-month sabbatical filled with nearly childlike joy. For years, this man had hated praying the breviary and felt there was something wrong with him because he struggled so mightily with his daily prayer. On sabbatical, he learned about prayer styles that fit different personalities, and voila! He found his happy home in centering prayer. He was so delighted with this kind of prayer that, upon his return, he asked his entire staff to learn and share the practice with him. Regardless of our personality types, we dutifully learned to practice centering prayer. Some of us took to it like ducks to water. Some of us didn't like it so much. But in all, we had the tremendous privilege of seeing with our own eyes the power of prayer to transform the life of another. As time unfolded we watched this man, known for his canon law skills and administrative acumen but not necessarily for his flexibility and compassion, become a man of tender heart and deep faith. He now has gone home to God and I miss this spiritual mentor in my life. To be honest, the practice of centering prayer ebbs and flows in my life. But this book review felt like an invitation to return to God in the silence of prayer.

And just why does all of this occur to me in this August moment? Because as I peruse the scriptures for our August Sundays, I have come face to face with excerpts from the Pauline Letter to the Ephesians. As I consider these second readings for each Sunday, my heart embraces each exhortation. I want to be that person who is faithful in all things and whose life bears witness to God's grace. Yet I wonder: How is that possible? How indeed can I imitate God, who is incomprehensible Mystery and all good? How can I live in steadfast love, put on a new self each day, try to understand the will of God, be kind, be compassionate and forgiving, give thanks always and for everything, embody the righteousness of God, and be subordinate to all people, seeing no one as greater than another?

How indeed does one do that? Well, one will never do it completely on this side of life. But one must try. And that book review seems like a gift of the Spirit as I feel my mentor's presence sitting next to me once again, beckoning, encouraging and inviting me

to the prayer of silent centering. In my heart of hearts, I remember his words of instruction. You can do this anywhere, anytime. Sit up straight (even straight-back chairs facing a wall in a hotel room can be a place for prayer), close your eyes, open your hands, find and repeat the word that is your word for God. Acknowledge distractions when they come and then return to your centering word. Never judge the silence or the time of prayer. Just give the time to God. For many of us, August is the time of new beginnings. School years begin. Programs increase. The leisure of summer comes to an end. And the readings of our liturgical year urge us to put on a new self each day and embody the compassion of God. Why not begin anew today?




