## ***Grand Knight's Report***

Brothers,

### **Nicolaus Copernicus**

Nicolaus Copernicus was a Polish Catholic priest who is known as the “Father of Modern Astronomy.” Born on February 19, 1473, Nicolaus was one of four children, two of whom later became priests and one a Cistercian nun.

Copernicus attended the University of Krakow, Poland, where he studied painting and mathematics and attended the University of Bologna to study canon law, Greek and astronomy. He also studied practical medicine at the University of Padua but did not get a degree. He attended the University of Ferrara also to study canon law. With his interest and knowledge of astronomy, Copernicus was soon lecturing on the subject.

Contrary to popular thought at the time, he believed that Earth was not the center of universe. Copernicus’ heliocentric solar system named the sun, rather than the earth as the center of the solar system.

Copernicus also studied medicine which he practiced for six years, providing care to the poor for free. At some point in his career, Copernicus is believed to have been ordained, and later became administrator of a diocese.

Nicolaus Copernicus died on May 24, 1543.

### **Chaplain’s Corner**

My Dear Brother Knights,

#### **Exploring the Mystery**

*If you would rise with me, rise through your destiny, do not refuse the death which brings you life, for as the grain in the earth must die for rebirth, so I have planted your life deep within mine.* (“All That Is Hidden,” (Bernadette Farrell).

It has been a privilege these last two years to accompany my friend Albert as he lived with cancer, faced numerous surgeries, embraced one treatment protocol after another, traveled to a distant city for experimental treatment and

finally came home to live fully until that was no longer possible. In the past many months, Albert and his wife continued to do as they have always done. They gathered friends and strangers at their table with a hospitality that must mirror God's own, cared for people in need and created opportunities for others to enjoy life. This serious illness did not deter their uncommon ability to embody compassion and generosity to others. Now as I write this Easter season column, the time has come. Albert is crossing from death to life, from darkness to dawn, and soon he will know rebirth.

*All that is hidden will be made clear. All that is dark now will be revealed. What you have heard in the dark, proclaim in the light. What you hear in whispers, proclaim from the housetops.*

We will hear during these Fifty Days that the disciples gathered behind locked doors in fear that they would meet the same fate as Jesus. They had lost all hope and were literally and figuratively locked in darkness. With no way to fathom the enormity of what had happened, they were focused on their own grief and held captive by their own fear of suffering and death.

Then, as we well know, Jesus appeared in their midst, breathed on them and promised that the Holy Spirit would remain with them. Courage replaced fear, and they left that darkened room renewed in hope and ready to tell the world that Jesus' suffering, death and rising had transformed the world. Inexplicably, Jesus' death had conquered human darkness. All these years later, we have heard this message, the message of this Easter season: All that is hidden in pain and sorrow will one day be made clear.

Every one of us has encountered the inexplicable mystery of suffering whose pain takes our breath away and breaks our heart. We know the widow who does the best she can to be both mother and father to her sons. We know the family who lives with the mental illness of a son or daughter. We know the child who works hard to overcome disability and "fit in" at school. We know the husband who drives his addicted wife to a residential treatment center and prays it will work. We know the mother who begins to worry three months before her son deploys to Afghanistan for his second or third tour of duty. We know the family who bears the wounds of clergy sexual abuse and the deeper scars of church betrayal. And we know the individual who fights the good fight to arrest cancer's growth and hold death at bay.

Yes, every one of us knows the darkness. And in the midst of whatever darkness we confront, it is faith's promise that life will come from death. Light will penetrate and transform the darkness of pain and suffering. For this is the Light who walked through the darkness, who beat it, and now turns to us and says: Follow me. I will take you where you do not want to go, but follow me. Follow me. I will lead and you will be OK. I will give you courage when you run short. I will send you human angels to share the load and remind you of my love. I will give you patience when you think you have none. I will fill you with my peace when it seems impossible to be calm within. I will lift you up when you want to give up.

I will give you courage to speak and to do what is right. Follow me. On this darkened night, dawn approaches, and with the dawn, Easter's promise:  
*If you would follow me, follow where life will lead, do not look for me among the dead, for I am hidden in pain, risen in love; there is no harvest without sowing of grain.*

Thank you, Albert, for teaching us how to follow so faithfully.




