***Grand Knight's Report***

**St. Peter's Basilica**

St. Peter was martyred in Rome on the Vatican Hill about the year 67 A.D., and was buried nearby in a pagan cemetery.

By 150 A.D., his tomb was marked with a monument. The Emperor Constantine built the first church over that tomb, incorporating the ancient monument. On November 18, 326, Pope Sylvester I consecrated the first basilica there, which survived until the 16<sup>th</sup> century, when construction on the present basilica began in 1514. That church was consecrated November 18, 1626 – 1,300 years after the original basilica had been inaugurated.

St. Peter's Basilica is the largest church in the Western world. World-famous artists and architects such as Michelangelo, Bernini and Raphael have worked on this building.

In 1939, Pope Pius XII began archaeological excavations under the basilica, after workers who were digging a tomb for his predecessor, Pius XI, discovered signs of an ancient cemetery under the basilica. Below the crypt floor they found St. Peter's tomb.

The altar in the upper church is located directly over the tomb of St. Peter, which is two levels below the main floor of the basilica. The crypt area below the main

floor provides space for the burial of popes and various Church dignitaries.

As I told you in my first homily, I place my trust completely in the hands of God. My favorite expression is everything is providential. When I got the call from God, I said YES. I don't mean a call on my iPhone. I am very happy in my vocation to be able to serve you, God's children.

My vision as pastor here at Saint Jude is to work together as one family, making Saint Jude a welcoming community, embracing a diverse Catholic Christian Community here in Budd Lake, sharing the love of Jesus Christ through different ways of prayer, ministry, education, and service. This is my vision, and I invite each of you to work with me and have my vision become your vision also.

As you may have already noticed, I am open to any suggestions, ideas and anything else that you would feel comfortable discussing with me. Finally, let us ask

the Holy Spirit to help us in our journey of faith as we continue building God's Kingdom here at Saint Jude Church. Please pray for me and I will pray for all of you so that God's grace strengthens us and our families as well. God Bless you.

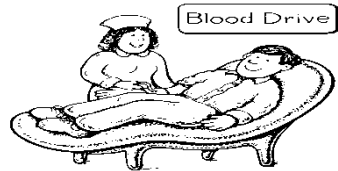

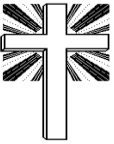

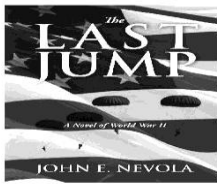
