Note: Council 6100 will pay the cost for the first 10 members to sign up.

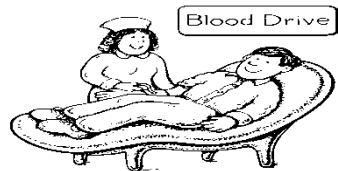

Back to School

Is there anyone out there who has not noticed the absence of children on the streets during the day? No question about it, school has reopened. 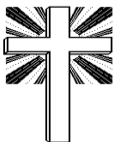

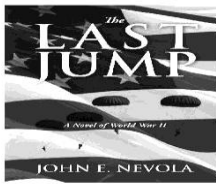
