Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

Praying the Mass: The Communion Rite

When I come to receive Communion, the minister of the Eucharist says to me, “The Body of Christ”, “The Blood of Christ,” and I say “Amen” to each.

Those are the biggest “Amens” I’ll ever say. I’m not simply saying “Amen” to the real presence. I’m saying “Amen” to receiving the Lord *into my life* – not some day when I’ve got everything worked out, but here and now.

In effect, I say, “Lord, I’m not perfect, and I don’t have all the answers. But I do believe in you, and I accept you into my life here and now.”

The cup has particular meaning. In Gethsemane, Jesus prayed, “*Father, if*

you are willing, take this cup away from me.” The cup of suffering wasn’t taken away. But by accepting it, Jesus found the path of life.

When I stand before the cup and say “Amen,” I’m saying, “Lord, I accept, as you did, whatever sufferings cannot be taken away. I trust, as you trusted, that God will somehow make this something good. And I trust that if you are with me, I can do it.”

Think about those two Amens. Spend some time on each. And the next time you receive Communion, say them with a conviction that comes from way down deep inside.

Insurance Message

Dear Brother Knights,

November is Long Term Care Insurance Month

Across the nation during the month of November is Long Term Care Insurance month. The Knights of Columbus continue to offer this insurance to all its members and spouses. Our program is built with many options to make the program affordable and effective. The ultimate goals of Long Term Care Insurance are to provide the insured the ability to live their lives with dignity while protecting assets that have taken a lifetime to achieve.

Some decisions that have to be made when selecting Long Term Care are elimination period, daily benefit, length of benefit and comprehensive or facility care. Additionally, if policies are taken by both member and spouse do you want shared or 10% discount rates.

So let's take a look at each decision:

- 1) Elimination (Waiting) period – The period is the time before the benefit kicks in. The choices are 30, 60, 90 or 180 days.
- 2) Daily Benefit – They range from \$50.00 to \$400.00 per day. The benefits go up in increments of \$10.00. In our area the average cost/day is about \$285.00.
- 3) Length of Benefit – This is length of time the benefit pays. The times are 3 or 5 years or lifetime.
- 4) Comprehensive or Facility – Facility policies cover only nursing home stays. Whereas, Comprehensive covers facility, day care or home care.
- 5) Shared and 10% discount – If Long Term Care policies are written for both husband and wife the policies can be shared. Simply, if one spouse needs to use more than their benefit period they may use all or part of their spouse's benefit. However, if there is only one policy written we offer a 10% discount on premiums. This 10% discount can be offered to both spouses should they decide to keep their policies separate.

Long Term Care is offered to the member and his spouse from the ages 30 – 85. And there is a medical requirement for your Long Term Care policy.

As an example, the member is 52 years of age and his spouse is 50 years of age. They elect Comprehensive Care, \$300.00/day benefit, 5 years length of benefit and 30 day elimination period. The annual cost of these policies is \$1,669.20 for the member and \$1,514.40 for his wife. To give you another perspective, that's \$100,500.00 each (\$201,000.00) per year for \$3,183.60 premium. Talk about asset protection!!

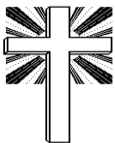

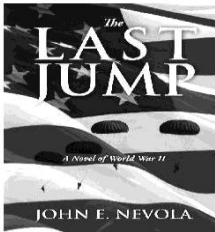
