Candy Cane Priest

A Catholic priest from the Diocese of Little Rock, Arkansas invented the machine that shapes candy canes. Candymaker Bob McCormack (founder of Bob's Candies in Albany, Georgia) had begun making candy canes for his children in the 1920's. The process was tedious. Twisting could only be done by hand and breakage often ran up to 22 percent of production. Perplexed at what to do, Bob turned to his wife Anna Louise's brother, Father Gregory

Harding Keller, for suggestions.

Father Keller had been dubbed the “family genius” because of his fascination for how things worked. As a student, he fixed the organ at the North American College in Rome. During the summer vacations, he would travel to Albany and work at the candy factory.

Father Keller listened to his brother-in-law’s predicament. Within six months, he had perfected the Keller Machine which twisted soft candy into spiral striping and cut the sticks to precise lengths.

Born May 24, 1895, in Little Rock, Father Keller studied for the priesthood in Rome, where he was ordained. He returned to Little Rock and served in parishes there for 36 years. Father Keller gained national attention as a contestant on the popular TV show, “What’s My Line?” in the 1960’s. He was the inventor priest.

Chaplain’s Corner

Dear Brother Knights of Columbus,

Celebrating New Year 2014

In a day or two we will be gathering to celebrate the New Year Feast. As we know, the first month of the New Year is January. The name "January" comes from the Roman god Janus, the god with two faces, one looking to the past and the other looking to the future. This is indeed a time to look back at the year that has just ended and to look forward to the New Year ahead of us. As Knight of Columbus Organization, how did we spend this one year of my life that has just passed? Did we use it to advance our goals and objectives in the life of our organization? Did we use it to enhance the purpose of our existence as an

organization? Could we have done better last year in the way we invested our time talents and treasure between the demands of work, family, friends, and the demands of my spiritual life? What things did we achieve last year and what did we fail to achieve? How can we consolidate the achievements of last year while reversing the failures and losses in this New Year? Through soul searching questions like these we find that a review of the past year naturally leads to setting goals and resolutions for the New Year.

We must set goals and make resolutions as a necessary conclusion to our review of the past year. And we do need to review our lives from year to year because, as Socrates says, the unexamined life is not worth living.

Today's Mass Media are full of individual and collective New Year resolutions. Most of those, however, are not resolutions at all but only wishes. What is the difference between a resolution and a wish? A wish identifies a goal one wants to reach; a resolution specifies the steps one will take to reach it. A wish says this is where I want to be, a resolution says this is the road I will take, and this is what I will do to get there. The wishful person says "I want to pass my exams this year" and the resolved person says "I will devote an extra hour to my studies everyday in order to pass my exams." The wishful person says "I will have more peace and love in my family this year" and the resolved person says "I will spend more time with my family at table instead of rushing off to the TV, so that we get to know and understand ourselves better." The wishful person says "I will live a life of union with God this year" and the resolved person says "I will set aside this time everyday to pray and hear God's word." The difference between wishing and resolving is: are we prepared to do what it takes to make our dreams come true, are we prepared to pay the price?

Our Blessed Mother, the Virgin Mary, is a model of that new life in Christ that all of us wish for ourselves in the New Year. There we see that Mary was prepared to do something to realize this goal. What did she do? We read that the shepherds, when they went to adore the Child Jesus in the manger, told all that the angels had said to them. "But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart" (Luke 2:19). Again after the boy Jesus was found in the Temple, we are told that "His mother treasured all these things in her heart" (Luke 2:51). Mary was a woman who valued the word of God, who treasured it and made time to meditate and ponder it. It is true that the holiness of Mary is attributed to the grace of God, but this should not make us forget that she needed to make an effort in order to cooperate with the grace of God. She pondered the word of God in order to discern what God was saying to her at every stage in her life as the handmaid of God.

Whatever the situation in which we find ourselves as an organization right now, I would like to invite all you to resolve this year, 2014, to work for unity as members of this wonderful organization. We are called to evangelize through helping the needy people, and the only way to evangelize the poor or needy people is if we are united in one spirit and in one heart. Let us not pretend to be

a Knight of Columbus member because we hurt our organization. Let us show out that we belong to the Knight of Columbus through our actions and work for unity.

Let us this New Year resolve to listen more to the voice of God, to treasure God's word and ponder it in our hearts. Then shall we be able to realize our New Year resolution of a new life in union with God and with one another.

Did you know that the Knights of Columbus in the Paterson Diocese is one of the largest supporters of group homes?

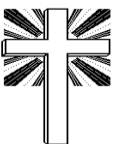

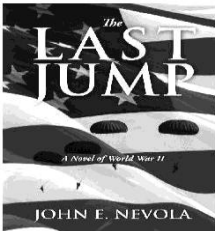
