Brothers,

It's me again! As you read this, our Grand Knight is making his way back to Budd Lake; I hope he doesn't see his shadow upon his return! John should be back in time for our Officers meeting and we have plenty of new opportunities to share with him.

As we slowly head into spring, we look ahead and start making our plans or lists in some cases of what we need to tackle outside. Be it home repairs, painting or landscaping, we spend plenty of time preparing. Do we take the same time and care to plan for our own spiritual needs?

This Lenten season, I would like to challenge you to find a new way to prepare yourself for Easter. Let's try putting a new spin on the traditional fasting, prayer and almsgiving. For example, giving up a half-hour of the time spent on the computer or social network at home and instead, taking a moment to pray for the people in this country and throughout the world whose main concern is what they are going to eat or in finding a warm safe place to spend the night. Spend the rest of that time reaching out to a friend or family member you may have fallen out of touch with, checking up on a friend in need or spending a little extra quality time with your spouse or child. Knights are scheduled to lead the Stations that start at 7:00pm.

As I mentioned above, we do have some great opportunities coming up for the council. Besides our usual plea for Bingo volunteers, we have our Drive for People with Intellectual Disabilities, scheduled for April 25<sup>th</sup> thru the 27<sup>th</sup>. I know this is an effort that is fully supported by the council and we will need all of you to chip in to make it a success. This year we'll need to man 2-hour shifts at the Shop-Rite in Flanders, the A&P in Budd Lake and Sam's Club. Sign-ups will begin in person at our next Business meeting on March 10<sup>th</sup> and also through email.

For those of you looking for something new and exciting, our council has been approached by the fundraising committee of St. Michael's School in Netcong. They are currently working to organize an Italian Festival to be held at the Waterloo Fairgrounds, May 28<sup>th</sup> thru June 1<sup>st</sup>. The intention is to have this become an annual event, what better way to kick-off the summer? They have already arranged to have food, rides, games, beer garden and a schedule of live entertainment every night. There will also be one evening that will cap off the event with a memorable fireworks display. All proceeds will go to improve the gym and buildings of St. Michaels School. In order to pull off an event of this size, we've been asked to provide some volunteer labor to man a few of the gaming booths. For our participation, the Knights of Columbus councils involved (Netcong and 6100) would receive sole ownership of the water and soda concessions for the entire event. We would need to man those concessions as well; however, all profits made on water and soda sales would come to the Knights. This is a win/win situation that has some great potential. The concept was presented at our last business meeting and all brothers in attendance thought it was something the council should pursue. We will continue to work with the St. Michael's team and provide additional updates/details as they develop. In the meantime, if you have any questions or would like to get involved, please let me know.

I hope you're looking forward to spring as much as I am. Please remember to take time to prepare yourselves for spiritual growth this Lent and give some serious thought into participating in one or more of the events we have coming up in the next few months.

**“time sensitive”**

It’s not too early to be looking at scholarships for 2014. Information and applications for all scholarships listed below can be obtained on line at our Council 6100 web site <http://www.kofc6100.org> and click on “Scholarship Info” in the home page table. The following summary includes 4 scholarships for HS Seniors entering college in the fall and one, a 4 year scholarship from the Paterson Federation, for students entering a Catholic HS.

#### **Council 6100 Scholarships**

- **Recipient:** Students graduating high school
- **Award:** 4 scholarships - \$1500, \$1000, \$500 (2)
- **Qualifications:** All applicants must be a resident of Mount Olive Township or a child of any Council 6100 member and are appraised on 5 categories: Scholastic Achievement, Church/Religious Institution activities, Community activities, Extra Curricular activities and Essay. The essay will describe the applicant’s reasons for continuing their education and why a scholarship is important to them.
- **Sponsor:** Knights of Columbus Council 6100
- **Deadline:** April 15<sup>th</sup> (date specified by the applicants high school may be earlier)

#### **Thomas Christopher DeLalla Memorial Scholarship**

- **Recipient:** Student graduating high school
- **Award:** \$1000
- **Qualifications:** All applicants must be a resident of Mount Olive Township or a child of any Council 6100 member and are appraised on dedicated commitment and

leadership in organizations or activities to benefit others, the community and the youth of Mount Olive Township. Special consideration will be given for participation and leadership in activities or programs which directly benefit local community youth organizations (e.g. religious organizations, squares, youth group, sports, scouting, other community youth based organizations.). An essay is required describing why a scholarship is important to the applicant and what the applicant did specifically that qualifies him/her as the best candidate to receive this scholarship.

- **Sponsor:** Knights of Columbus Council 6100
- **Deadline:** April 15<sup>th</sup> (date specified by the applicants high school may be earlier)

### **Ernie DiCicco Sr. Scholarship**

- **Recipient:** Student graduating high school.
- **Award:** \$1000/yr, up to 4 years.
- **Qualifications:** The applicant must be active in church, community and school activities. The first preference is to a parishioner of St. Jude's parish in Budd Lake. A 500 word essay must be written to explain why the student should be considered worthy of this award. The above criteria are main consideration, but this does not rule out other candidates who can show similar involvement. This scholarship can be renewed annually for up to 3 additional years providing the student maintains a B average and remains a full time student
- **Sponsor:** Ernie DiCicco Sr. Scholarship Fund through the Knights of Columbus Council 6100
- **Deadline:** April 15<sup>th</sup> (date specified by the applicants high school may be earlier)

- **Recipient:** Students entering their freshman year of college
- **Award:** \$1000 annually for four (4) years.
- **Qualifications:** Children, siblings or grandchildren of any fraternal brother in the Knights of Columbus order. The applicants must be sponsored by a member of the New Jersey Knights of Columbus in good standing, a resident of New Jersey, and entering their freshman year of college. The applicant need not attend a Catholic high school or plan to attend a Catholic college or university.
- **Sponsor:** New Jersey State Knights of Columbus Bishop Dougherty Scholarship Fund

- **Deadline:** March 1 to the council GK and April 1 to the State Chairman

**Paterson Federation Scholarship:**

- **Recipient:** Student entering a Catholic High School

The criteria for selection is mainly based on the objective scores in a national test which students must take to graduate in NJ and the student’s performance during his/her years in school. In addition a short essay is required along with a summary of the applicant’s volunteer work performed for church and/or the community.

- **Deadline:** May 15<sup>th</sup>

Insurance Notes

There are 2 subjects this month that I would like to discuss:

The first is we're in that awful (for some) time of year. We call it tax season. And it's time to pay the piper. For those of you who have Knights of Columbus IRA or Roth IRA annuities it's not too late to make your 2013 contribution. This year the maximum contribution is \$5,500.00 unless you're over 50, then it's \$6,500.00. Also, you can set

up an IRA or Roth IRA for 2014. The rate of return on your money is 2.6% with a guaranteed minimum of 1.5%. And you can rollover existing annuities into our fixed rate program. I want you to remember that the Knights are here to protect our families and that means protecting your assets.

And secondly, did you know that you can assign an insurance contract to pay for your funeral? This is especially helpful if you or your parents are facing reducing assets to meet Medicaid minimums. Don't go out of pocket if you don't have to. Remember that Medicaid will want the cash value of the policies assigned to them. This is a way of paying for a funeral and reducing assets.




