Brothers,

### **Pontius Pilate**

In the minds of many people, Pilate is thought to have been a high-ranking Roman ruler. After all, his name even today is known all over the world. The truth is, Pilate was one of many governors in the Roman Empire, assigned to a relatively small, non-prestigious post far, far from Rome. His power did not even extend over the whole of Israel – he governed only the southern part.

Had it not been for his involvement in the crucifixion of Jesus, Pilate would be an obscure and unknown figure in world history. For example, who knows the name of his predecessor? (For the record, it was Valerius Gratus.) As it is, “Pilate” is now a household word. Every time the creed is said, his name is mentioned.

At that time some people who were present there told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with the blood of their sacrifices. (Lk 13:1)

Someday I’m going to die. It might happen through cruelty (like those Galileans killed by Pilate, or by accident (like those people in Jerusalem killed when a tower fell upon them). But inevitably, I’m going to die one way or another, and in the perspective of the long sweep of history, I’m going to die relatively soon. Life is short. I’m living on borrowed time.

I’m always going to start a diet – next week. Always thinking that I’ve got to get around to patching up some bad blood in my family – one of these days. Perhaps I need a nudge to do that something now, because it always seems to be “tomorrow” that I’m going to do what I ought to do with my life.

There’s never a good time to do things that are hard to do. But the Gospel reminds me today that life is short. There are tremendous opportunities today to do some of those things that I need to do. To start. Lord help me not to put them off until tomorrow. Today may be all the time I have.



***On the Lighter Side***

**Overweight**

A new report suggests that being overweight is not as harmful as is commonly believed, and actually confers some surprising benefits.

Being five to ten pounds overweight could protect people from ailments ranging from tuberculosis to Alzheimer's disease, research indicates. Those carrying 15 to 25 extra pounds are better able to recover from adverse conditions such as emphysema, pneumonia, and


