Fig Tree

In the time of Jesus, the fig tree was popular and plentiful in the Middle East. Often called a “poor man’s food,” figs are rich in calcium, phosphorus and iron. The Greeks believed the fig was a sacred gift from Demeter, the goddess of the harvest. It is also known as the Tree of Life and Knowledge in some Far East and African countries.

Figs are one of the seven foods mentioned when the Israelites reached the Promised Land. It was one of the “first fruits” brought to the Temple each year in thanksgiving for God’s bounty.

Figs were one of the earliest fruits to be cultivated – first in Asia, then Greece and other Mediterranean countries. Today Algeria is the largest

producer of figs in the world.

And Jesus told them this parable: “There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it but found none, he said to the gardener, “For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. [So] cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?”

Upcoming Council Election

The Nominating Committee diligently worked to draw up the slate of officers for the upcoming Columbian Year (2014-2015). The slate of officers will be officially announced at the May Business Meeting, Monday *May 12th* by the chairman of the committee.

The officers on that slate will include: Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Chancellor, Warden, Treasurer, Advocate, Recorder, Inside Guard, Outside Guard, Trustee (3 Year), Trustee (2 Year) and Trustee (1 Year). Note: the Chaplain is a Council appointed position and Financial Secretary is a Supreme Appointment – Not voted upon.

As a means of gaining a better understanding of the duties of the various Council's Officers the following definitions are provided.

Grand Knight - The Grand Knight (GK) is the Chief Executive Officer of the Council and is responsible for the overall welfare of the Council. Elected annually by the council membership, the Grand Knight must provide thoughtful and inspired leadership to the other council officers, the service program directors, program chairmen and council members. More specifically his duties include: presiding over council meetings. Acting as an ex-officio member of all committees, appointing the membership and program director and working with them to recruit and appoint the committee chairmen, recruiting team members and any necessary ad hoc committees not mandated by the laws of the council. He is also responsible for overseeing the proper exemplification of the First Degree and finally making sure all reports and forms required by the State and Supreme are completed and submitted on time. The GK also interacts with the Financial Secretary and Treasurer to insure the council is meeting its financial obligations. The Grand Knight countersigns all disbursement requests drawn by the Financial Secretary and checks signed and drawn by the Treasurer. In essence the Grand Knight is responsible for the oversight of council finances and record keeping

activities. He is also responsible for budget preparation and must insure the membership is kept informed as to the financial status of the Council. The GK is also a member of the Advisory Board charged with the general supervision of the of the council's Columbian Squire Circle.

Deputy Grand Knight – The Deputy Grand Knight (DGK) is second in command of the council. He is elected annually, assists the Grand Knight in the operation of the council and is responsible for any duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. Historically these have been to chair the major fund raising activities to polish his organization and coordination skills in preparation for consideration as a candidate for Grand Knight. In the absence of the Grand Knight, the DGK presides at council meetings and functions as the Grand Knight would in other matters to include financial signatory authority. The DGK is also a member of the Squires Advisory Board. It is usually suggested that the DGK serve as a member of the Membership and Retention Committees.

Chancellor – The Chancellor is the third ranking Council Officer. The Chancellor is elected annually to serve the Council in a variety of ways. The chancellor has a variety of responsibilities. Primarily, he assists the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in the performance of their duties and takes charge of the Council during the incapacity or absence of both. With the support of the Grand Knight, the Chancellor is responsible for responding to members in distress by bring the problem to the attention of the Grand Knight and ordering Mass cards, flowers and fruit baskets as appropriate. He also assists the program chairmen in the resolution of issues that do not require the Grand Knight's intervention. He is charged with strengthening the members' interest in council activities. When a council has a Squire's Circle he usually is a member of the Squire's Ceremonial Team.

Warden – The Warden is elected annually by the membership. He is responsible for supervising and maintaining council property with the exception of those items specifically assigned to the financial secretary. He also sets up the council chambers for meetings and degrees and selects and supervises the guards for ceremonials. He also is trains and supervises the inside and outside guards to insure that they fulfill their assigned duties. The Warden assures that all members at meetings possess the current membership card. He is custodian of all Council property except funds and is in charge of properly setting up the Council Chamber. He directs the activities of the Inside and Outside Guards.

Recorder – The Recorder functions in much the same way as a court reporter or organizational secretary. He is responsible for keeping a true record of all the actions of the council and maintains a record of council correspondence. He uses the Recorder's Minute Book (Form # 1403), which is available from the Supreme Supply Department, to record the

minutes of all council meetings. The Recorder keeps the minutes of the meetings, conducts correspondence as directed by the Grand Knight, and keeps official historic documents of the Council. In the absence of the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight, he presides at Council meetings.

Treasurer – The Treasurer keeps all funds, maintains the accounts of the Council, and issues Council checks upon receipt of a proper voucher from the Financial Secretary. He is responsible for depositing money into the council's accounts and provides a certificate of such monies to the grand knight. He is also responsible for the payment of all expenses.

Advocate – The Advocate is the Chief Legal Officer of the Council and should serve as the council's attorney at trials and investigations of any interest to the council. The advocate need not be an attorney but he should be familiar with the laws of the order as stated in the Charter and Constitution as well as the council by-laws, the Order's Charter, Constitution and Laws (#30), Methods of Conducting a Council Meeting (#1937), and Robert's Rules of Order. The advocate serves as chairman of the committee whenever the by-laws are amended.

Guards – The Inside Guard(s) and Outside Guard(s) are charged with the security of the Council Chamber and assist the Warden in meeting the duties of his Office. The guards have similar responsibilities, but distinct differences. The outside guard tends to the outer door admitting visitors and members to the inner door. Once at the inner door, the inside guard checks to make sure that their membership cards are current.

Trustees – The Board of Trustees consists of three members elected by the council and the grand knight, who serves as chairman of the board. They oversee the financial transactions of the Council, review all bills and financial reports and audit the Council's financial records semi-annually. They oversee the work of the financial secretary and treasurer, and with the deputy grand knight serve on the council's retention committee. During council elections, only the three-year trustee is voted on, with the others moving on to become two-year and one-year trustees, respectively.






