***Grand Knight's Report***

Brothers,

**St. Angela Merici**

St. Angela Merici was the foundress of the first Catholic teaching order of women. Angela was born on March 21, 1474 in Desenzano, Italy. An orphan at age 10, she and her sister went to live with an uncle. As a young woman, she returned to Desenzano. Concerned about the lack of religious instruction for girls, she set up a school in her home to teach them about their Catholic faith. Her school was successful, and soon Angela was invited to establish a similar school in the nearby town of Brescia.

In the Church's jubilee year of 1525, Angela traveled to Rome to gain the indulgence for pilgrims to Rome during that year. Pope Clement VII heard she was there, and invited her to remain in Rome to take charge of a religious order of nursing sisters. Angela declined and returned home.

But the pope's interest in her work got her thinking. On November 25, 1535, she gathered together a group of young women to form what would become the order of the Usulines, the first group of women religious to work outside the cloister. She served as their superior until her death in 1540.

The feast of St. Angela Merici is celebrated on January 27. She is the patron of people who have lost their parents.
