### **Attention Brothers – Council Has Gone “Green”**

*The Council would like all brothers who have a computer and internet access to get their newsletters electronically (not mailed). Brothers who do not have a computer will still be able to get a hard copy of the newsletter mailed to them.*

**Note: After September all Council members who get a mailed copy of the newsletter will have to inform me either by regular mail, e-mail or telephone how they would like to receive their newsletter. We want to reduce the mailed newsletters to the least number as possible. Newsletters will not be mailed to members who don't respond to this request.**

*When I started as newsletter editor in September 1996 it cost the Council roughly \$70.00 to print and \$30.00 to mail the newsletter each month. In June 2014 it cost the Council \$124.02 to print and mail the newsletter. Currently it costs \$0.40 to print and between \$0.173 and \$0.191 to bulk mail each newsletter. With the Council's membership growing this cost can only go up. The Council cannot afford this expense every month. The yearly cost is approximately \$2,000.00. Wouldn't it be better to spend some of that money on charitable causes?*

*The Council's website ([www.kofc6100.org](http://www.kofc6100.org)) has a link that contains the monthly newsletter from July 2009 to the latest newsletter in pdf format. If you provide your e-mail, you will receive a reminder from Brother Ernie DiCicco when the new newsletter is posted. Last month 212 newsletters were mailed, 12 above the minimum needed for bulk mailing rates. Thus far one hundred eight brothers have informed me that they will get their newsletter from our website or by mail. That leaves approximately two hundred members who haven't informed me how they want to receive the newsletter. Please send your*

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## **2014 Scholarship Winners**

On Thursday night June 12<sup>th</sup> Council 6100 presented scholarships to 6 high school students at the Senior Awards Ceremony held at the Mount Olive HS Performing Arts Center. This adds another \$8,500 to the more than \$100,000 in scholarship monies awarded over the past years by our Council to students in our Mount Olive community. The 4 Council 6100 scholarships presented this year by Scholarship Chair Tom DeLalla were awarded to:

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The Council scholarship committee received 29 applications which was the same as last year and all from Mt. Olive HS. Typically our average has been running around 22 per year. The 29 applications ties last year's number, which represent the highest totals received.

The scholarship committee, Jim Sweeney, Dave Rose, Lenny Martin and Joe Mitru, under the direction of committee chair Tom DeLalla, reviewed all Council 6100 applications and selected the winners based on the highest appraisals across the 5 categories: Scholastic Achievement, Church/Religious Institution activities, Community activities, Extra Curricular activities and Essay.

As in all previous years, to remove any bias in the selection process, all applications are reviewed by the committee with the applicants identity removed. Each committee member independently reviews and scores each application on a point system. The top 4 scores from each committee member are revealed at the selection meeting. Our process has proven to be an extremely efficient and effective way to reach consensus in selecting the winners. Even though we have different committee members from time to time the results year after year using this process have been consistent across the board for selecting the winners. However this year proved to be a real challenge with many applicants providing very good essays and qualifications.

The Thomas Christopher De Lalla Memorial Scholarship, in its 10<sup>th</sup> year, was awarded to the candidate who best met the scholarship criteria for accomplishment, commitment, dedication, and leadership in activities and organizations to benefit others, the community and the youth of Mount Olive Township. The winner was selected from a pool 25 applicants all of which were from Mt. Olive HS. This is also the highest number of applications received over the past 10 years and also proved to be a challenge in selecting a winner this year.

This is the 8<sup>th</sup> year the Ernie DiCicco Sr. scholarship was awarded and presented in

the amount of \$4,000 (\$1,000/yr for 4 years). The winner was chosen by the DiCicco family from a pool of 15 applicants. The selection was made based on overall participation in church, community and school activities in addition to a 500 word essay. Funding for this scholarship is provided through contributions to the Council 6100 Scholarship Fund specifically made in memory of Ernie DiCicco Sr. This \$1,000/year scholarship will be renewed annually for up to 4 years providing student maintains a B average and is a full time student.




