Attention Brothers

Note: This is the last mailed copy of the newsletter you will receive unless you inform me either by regular mail, e-mail or telephone how you would like to receive your newsletter. The Council wants to reduce the mailed newsletters to the least number of brothers as possible. Newsletters will not be mailed to members who don't respond to this request.

Evidently Council members do not take this notice seriously or don't bother reading the newsletter when it gets delivered. Only a handful of brothers have contacted me that they still want their newsletters mailed (they don't have computers).

<u>Council members who currently get their newsletter</u> <u>electronically do not have to notify me.</u>

The Council would like all brothers who have a computer and internet access to get their newsletters electronically (not mailed). Brothers who do not have a computer will still be able to get a hard copy of the newsletter mailed to them.

When I started as newsletter editor in September 1996 it cost the Council roughly \$70.00 to print and \$30.00 to mail the newsletter each month. In August 2014 it cost the Council \$123.69 to print and mail the newsletter. Currently it costs \$0.40 to print and between \$0.173 and \$0.191 to bulk mail each newsletter. With the Council's membership growing this cost can only go up. The Council cannot afford this expense every month. The yearly cost is approximately \$2,000.00. Wouldn't it be better to spend some of that money on charitable causes?

Currently, our Council team is made up of eight volunteers. We buy the food, cook the food in their kitchen, serve the food, and then clean-up afterward. Each team works one day every month.


