Dear Brothers of Knights of Columbus,

I'm so happy to reflect with all of you about Thanksgiving.

Let me start with the Gospel according to Luke:

**“Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none**

**but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" (Luke 17: 17-18)**

Ingratitude has been called "the most unkindest cut of all." Yes, it is so easy to fall in love with the gift and forget all about the Giver; to admire a painting and never think of the painter; to enjoy music and never know the heart from which it came; to accept and love ourselves and not to care for the One from whom we came.

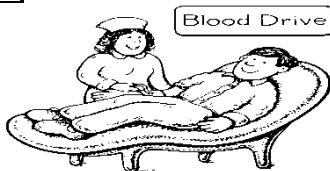
The Divine Mercy prayer group meets on the first Friday and the second Sunday of each month at 3:00 PM in the Daily Chapel of St. Jude Church.

The Faith Kitchen (Soup Kitchen) located on Blackwell St. Dover, NJ has been serving the poor and hungry Monday-Saturday since 1983. Trink Schwartz, Director of Faith Kitchen told us they served 64 meals that year. Today Faith Kitchen serves 34,409 meals each year. Meals are prepared by volunteers from many faiths and groups. We give thanks that the peace of God can be shared as volunteers come together to give their gifts of hospitality. The goal of the Faith Kitchen is to serve a nutritious meal, free of charge, to anyone who comes in, no questions asked.

Currently, our Council team is made up of eight volunteers. We buy the food, cook the food in their kitchen, serve the food, and then clean-up afterward. Each team works one day every month.

As Jesus said to his Disciples, “Whatever you did for the least of my brothers, you did it for me.”

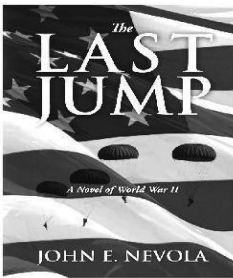
