
Divine Mercy Prayer Group

The goal of the Faith Kitchen is to serve a nutritious meal, free of charge, to anyone who comes in, no questions asked.

Currently, our Council team is made up of eight volunteers. We buy the food, cook the food in their kitchen, serve the food, and then clean-up afterward. Each team works one day every month.



Business Meeting Highlights

The highlights of the Business Meeting of November 10th held at Enzo's Italian Restaurant were as follows (approximately 22 members present):

The following motions were presented to and voted upon by the Council during this Business Meeting:

1. Mike Mallon made the second reading of a motion for the Council to provide up to \$4,000.00 to support the parish CYO basketball program. These monies are to support up to 4 teams at a maximum of \$1,000.00 per team. The motion was tabled last month. One team (Boys' Varsity) will be funded. The motion was seconded by Joe Barrett, and it passed by a voice vote.
2. A motion to provide up to \$2,000.00 to fund the Council's Annual Christmas Party scheduled for December 20th was made by Jim Sweeney. Like last year, all Brothers and a guest are invited as long as they're members in good standing. Dave Rose seconded the motion, and it passed by a voice vote. This constituted the first reading of this motion because of the amount. This motion will be acted upon at the next business meeting.
3. John Mania made a motion for the Council to donate \$7,500.00 and adopt a parish in need. This motion will allow the "Santa Chelidonia" Parish in Subiaco, Italy, make much needed repairs that they can't afford. The motion was seconded by Mike Mallon and after a lengthy discussion a hand vote was taken (10 for, 9 against and 2 abstentions). The motion failed.

Monthly assistance is needed to bridge the budget gap caused by a recent rent increase and rise in cost of living expenses. The motion was seconded by Jim Sweeney and passed by a voice vote. This constituted the first reading of this motion because of the amount. This motion will be acted upon at the next business meeting.
6. A motion for the Council to donate \$500.00 to help a "Priest in Need. Having retired from the Paterson Diocese, Father Donal Selia continues to serve the poor in Puerto Rico. Father Selia needs assistance to cover medical expenses not accepted by his medical insurance. Frank Ruggiero seconded the motion, and it passed by a voice vote.
7. Bob Calbo made a motion for the Council to provide funding up to \$300.00 to purchase Thanksgiving turkeys for the needy of St. Jude Parish. The motion was seconded by Gil Ceresa, and it passed by a voice vote.

8. A motion for the Council to provide funding up to \$100.00 for the Paragon Village Christmas Party was made by Jim Sweeney. This year, our Squires will be coordinating the event. Dave Rose seconded the motion, and it passed by a voice vote.


