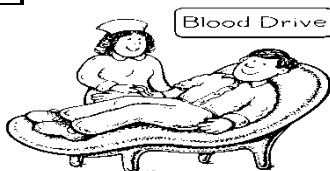
## ***Divine Mercy Prayer Group***

Trink Schwartz, Director of Faith Kitchen told us they served 64 meals that year. Today Faith Kitchen serves 34,409 meals each year. Meals are prepared by volunteers from many faiths and groups. We give thanks that the peace of God can be shared as volunteers come together to give their gifts of hospitality. The goal of the Faith Kitchen is to serve a nutritious meal, free of charge, to anyone who comes in, no questions asked.

Currently, our Council team is made up of eight volunteers. We buy the food, cook the food in their kitchen, serve the food, and then clean-up afterward. Each team works one day every month.

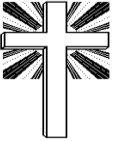

The highlights of the Business Meeting of December 8<sup>th</sup> held at Enzo's Italian Restaurant were as follows (approximately 29 members present and Insurance Agent Marti Ertl):

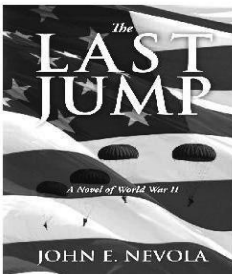
